

The Oakley City Council met in special session on October 28, 2020, at 5:15 PM, at 215 Hudson Avenue, and streamed live at <https://www.facebook.com/discoveroakley/live> for the object and purpose of considering the purchase of a compactor for the Oakley Landfill.

Council members present. Leasa Huddle, Russ Kahle, and Ilene Nickel; Chris Dorman was present via Zoom.

City staff present. City Administrator Bradley Pendergast, City Clerk Leann Hughes, and Refuse Director Marc Burris

Others present. None.

Call to order. Mayor Stephenson called the meeting to order at 5:15 PM.

Clerk Hughes read a request for a special meeting, as follows We, the undersigned Council Members of the City of Oakley, Kansas hereby respectfully request you to call a special meeting of the City Council to be held at 5:15 PM, on October 28, 2020, at 215 Hudson Avenue, for the object and purpose of considering the purchase of a compactor for the Oakley Landfill. #### NEW DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEMS:

Landfill Compactor Purchase. Administrator Pendergast reported that the salesman from Foley contacted him asking for a decision on whether or not the City would like to purchase the used compactor available. He asked for a decision prior to the next regular meeting on November 2, 2020, because they have others interested in the equipment. Discussion followed. Pendergast presented financing options for the purchase of the used compactor, at a cost of \$247,000 less \$30,000 trade-in, as follows: 1. Farmers State Bank, Oakley, KS – 3.60% - 5 years; 2. First Bank, Sterling, KS – 3.35% - 7 years; 3. Peoples State Bank, Oakley, KS – 4.95% - 5 years; 4. The Bank, Oakley, KS – 2.97% - 3 years; and 5. The Bank, Oakley, KS – 3.32% - 5 years. Council Member Nickel inquired if there is any warranty on this equipment. Pendergast phoned the salesman, who stated there is a 90 day parts only warranty. Discussion followed concerning the terms and the fact that longer terms would be easier on the budget. It was the consensus of the Council to move forward with the purchase, pending financing with The Bank for a 5 year term, if the payments can be in arrears.

Adjourn. Huddle moved to adjourn the meeting. Kahle seconded. Motion carried unanimously. Action (#11431). Mayor Stephenson adjourned the meeting at approximately 5:32 PM.
